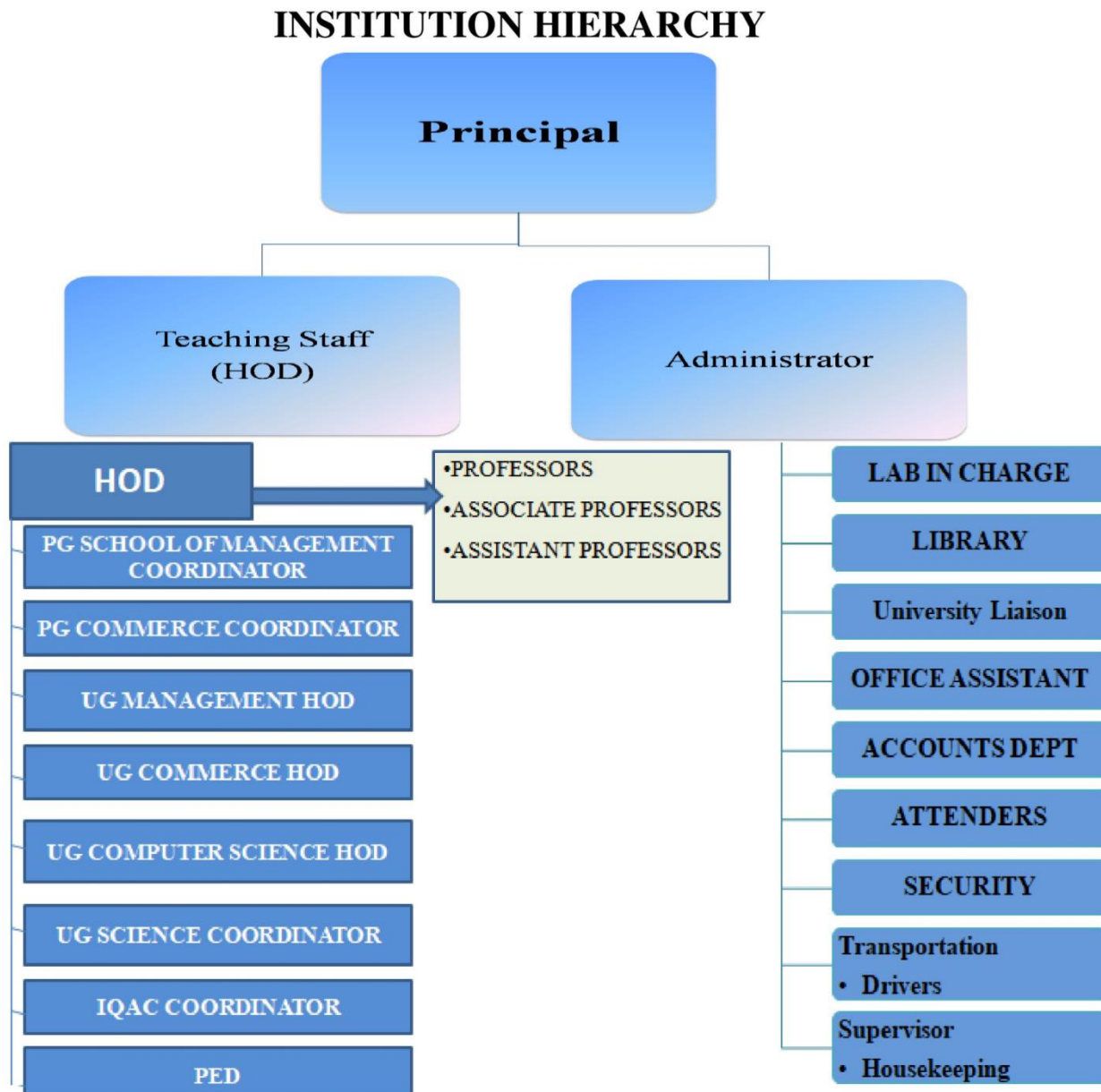



Karnataka Postgraduate Common Entrance Test is conducted by the Karnataka Examinations Authority (KEA). Karnataka PGCET General Eligibility criteria:

- Nationality: The candidate must be a citizen of India.
- Domicile: Candidates from the home state must have a domicile of Karnataka for getting a reservation.
- Other State Candidates: Candidates from other states can also apply for Karnataka PGCET but they will not be eligible for getting any reservation.
- Educational qualification: Bachelor's Degree or equivalent with a minimum of 3 years duration
- Qualifying marks: Candidates need to get a minimum of 50% marks in all the subjects., including languages
- Reservation category:45% of marks is required in the qualifying examination for SC, ST, and Category-I candidates of Karnataka state







The Context
